FIELD TRIP TO EDAKKAL CAVES

One-day field trip was organised by social science association of St Gregorios teachers training college to historical sit Edakkal caves and Wayanad heritage museum at Ambalavayal on 20.1.2020. Edakkal cave, which contains the earliest examples of world art and evidence of Neolithic and Megalithic Civilization in Wayanad, is located on the Ambukuthi hill at height of 4000 feet above sea level.

Edakkal caves are carve out of smooth stones and one of the cave inscriptions is in Tamil ancient Brahmi script stating about a ruler one who killed many tigers. Sanskrit Kannada words are also inscribed the walls of Edakkal cave. The Edakkal cave rock carvings feature strange headdresses and human figures with raised arms wearing what appear to be feather ornaments. Arrows and bows and the figures of a man and a dog give clues to the tribal culture of that time. Now Edakkal cave is under the protection of Archaeology department of India, Edakkal Cave is in the process of getting a place in the UNESCO World Heritage list.

TRIP TO PAZHAZI TOMB

The famous Pazhassi Museum and Pazhassi tomb are located at a short distance from the college. As the first princely state rebellion against British rule in India, the history of Pazhassi Raja and gorilla war with tribal army were very important in Indian History.

Kerala Varma Pazhassi Raja also known as Veera Pazhassi was the head of the princely state Kottayam in the Malabar region of Kerala. Pazhassi rebellion against the British is counted as one of the earliest acts of freedom fight in India. He earned the title "Kerala Simham" (Lion of Kerala) on accounts of his martial exploits. Every year the college organise trips and programs as part of Pazhassi commemoration.






JAIN TEMPLE SULTHAN BATHERY

The Jain Temple in Sulthan Bathery is a 13th-century temple built during the Vijayanagara Empire It is one of the most important Jain temples in Kerala, with a rich history and beautiful architecture. The temple was initially used as a shrine but was later converted into battery storage by Tipu Sultan of Mysore. Today it is a protected monument under the Archaeological Survey of India. In every year field trips were arranged for the teacher students of our institution. These field trips helped them to know the rich cultural heritage of Wayanad and historical importance of Sulthan Bathery.
